Point shared thanks to Bowerman's late stunner

Following the Robins opening day defeat away at Berkhamsted we needed an improved performance against newly promoted Uxbridge in our first game of the season at the SB stadium.

In front of a crowd of 723, the game kicked off with both teams looking to get an early foothold. The Robins began to show much more intent than the previous week but were still struggling to find enough possession to make an early impact.

With neither goalkeeper under any real pressure the first half took a while to get going, there were promising signs, but Uxbridge were up for the battle and were not going to be easy to breakdown.

The only real highlight of the first half was a long-range strike from Joe Grant that struck the bar but rebounded safely for a goal kick, although both sides had a couple of chances, they failed to break the deadlock going into the break. The Robins had more of the ball in the first 45 minutes but there was still a lot of room for improvement.

The second half started a lot more positively, the Robins taking early control of the proceedings ex Robin, Mark Scott in the Uxbridge goal, made two good early saves to deny Jordan Esprit.

The Robins still had the upper hand but fell behind after 65 minutes, Bernie Tanner made himself some space, and in a mirror image of Joe Grant's earlier strike, his long-range effort, tipped onto the by Michael Eacott, the ball rebounded into space in the box and the dangerous Dan Rowe was first to react to put Uxbridge ahead with a simple header past a helpless Micheal Eacott.

Spurred on by the crowd, the Robins needed to find a way back into the game, but Uxbridge were making it difficult and once again Mark Scott was on hand to preserve their lead.

Uxbridge should have been reduced to 10 men when last man, Bocarro's deliberate trip on Francis Amartei avoided an early shower when the referee only brandished a yellow card. With time running out and the Robins still showing more attacking intent, the game became a little feisty.

However, shortly after, in the 81st minute, a quickly taken freekick to Seb Bowerman in space had the time and composure to strike curling shot from 20 yards into the top right-hand corner despite the efforts of Mark Scott and an attempted headed clearance from the Uxbridge defender to put the Robins level.

Uxbridge closed out the game. The Robins performance was much better but still needs improving, with several new faces in the squad it will take a little time for things to gel.

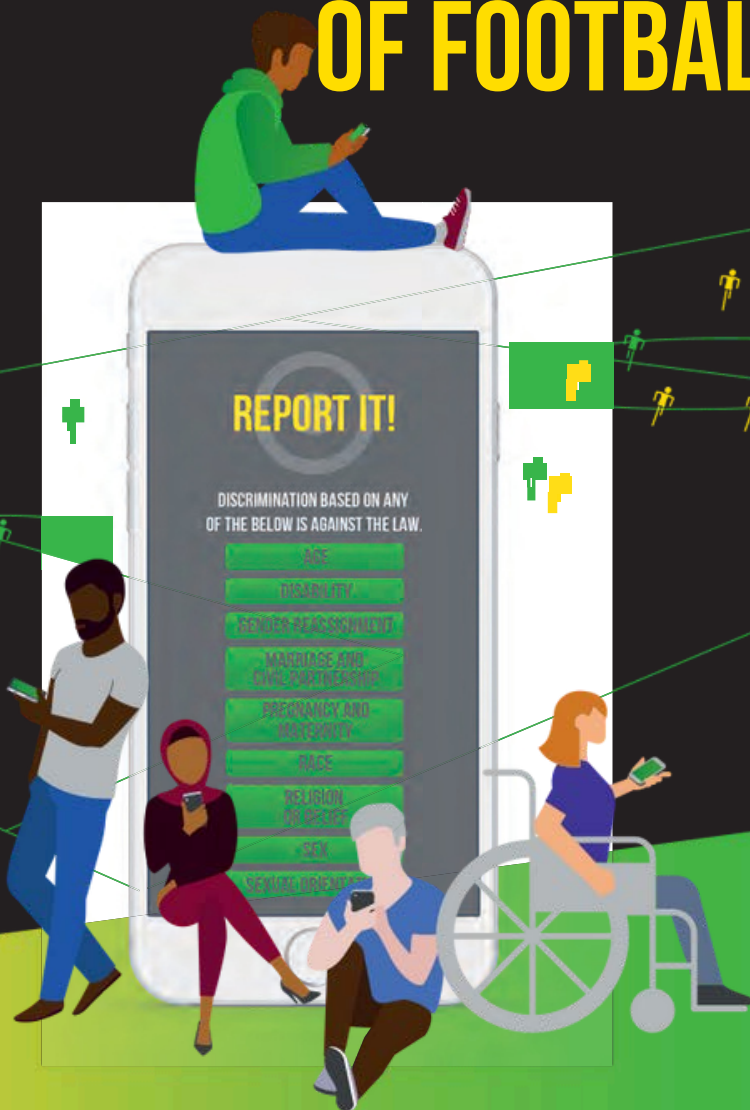
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Bracknell Town Football Club, formed in 1896, as Old Bracknell Wanderers and changed its name to Bracknell F.C. in 1949.

The club played in the local leagues until joining the Great Western league. After four seasons in this league and renaming the club Bracknell Town in 1962 the club was elected to the Surrey Senior League, which they won in the 1969/70 season. The club also won the league cup in 1968/69 and 1969/70. After this success, the club entered the Spartan League (later re-named the London Spartan League) and finished runners up on goal average in 1975/76, in which they also reach the fifth round of the FA Vase.

After winning the league in 1982/83, they were promoted in 1984 to the Isthmian League Division Two South. They were promoted to Division One as runners-up in 1985/86, finishing third in their highest ever league placing. However, in 1988/89, Bracknell Town were relegated and following a re-organisation of the Isthmian League were placed in Division Three in 1991/92.

2016 – 2017

At the start of the 2016/17 season under the guidance of new chairman Kayne Steinborn-Busse the club embarked on a major re-development of the ground with the installation of a state-of-the-art 3G pitch, changing facilities and club house and in keeping with this total modernisation re-branded the clubs logo. The reaped major benefits from this work with all teams down to the youngest age group now able to play and train at Larges Lane.

2017 – 2018

In 2017/2018 season we had a titanic battle with Thatcham Town for the top slot, both teams accumulating 98 points for the season with Thatcham Town's superior goal difference of 104 goals securing the title by a mere 2 goals. However, due to a restructure of the leagues our efforts were rewarded with promotion to Step 4 in to the Bostik South Central League. We also managed to get our own back by beating Thatcham in the final of the Bluefin Sport Challenge Cup to add yet another trophy to our collection.

2018 – 2019

The 2018/19 season was our first venture into Step 4 for many years and once again we

came close, finishing second behind Hayes & Yeading and missing out on promotion by losing the play-off final to Cheshunt. We reached the semi-final of the Velocity Trophy with impressive victories against sides much higher up the footballing pyramid.

The Covid Years

Despite both the 2019/2020 and 2020/21 seasons being cut short by Covid, the club's on-field ambitions were matched by our efforts off the field. We embarked on a project to move away from Larges Lane to build a new 2500 capacity stadium at Bottom Meadow, Sandhurst, which hosted our first competitive match in August 2021.

2021 – 2022

2021/2022, a monumental season for the club, we gained promotion to Step 3 for the first time in our history. The Isthmian League South Central title secured with 96 points out of a possible 108 with a 20-point winning margin.

2022-2023

Under the guidance of joint managers Jamie McClurg & Carl Withers our first season in Step 3 was one that will go down in the club's history. Reaching the 1st Round of the FA Cup and home tie against Ipswich Town FC, one game away from the quarter finals of the FA Trophy, our journey ending in a home defeat to Altrincham FC. Runners-up in the Southern Premier, missing out on promotion to Step 2 to a 90th minute goal against Truro Town.

2023 – 2024

A new state-of-the-art 3G pitch, the first of its kind in the UK, completed during the summer of 2023, at Bottom Meadow, Sandhurst.

A reshaped squad and a managerial change mid-way through the season did not stop Jordan Ive and the team putting together fantastic late run to make the play-offs for the second consecutive year. Alas, a 2-1 defeat by AFC Totton in the semi-final ended our hopes of reaching step 2 for another season.

2024 – 2025

Another big year for the club, Bracknell Town FC was sold to new owners in July 2024, but control was returned to The SB Group in April 2025. Kayne Steinborn-Busse will raise the standards both on and off the pitch and as part of the process Jordan Ive is back as manager for the 20205/2026 season.



Heads Up

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In the beginning....

Poole FC were formed on 20th September 1890 by the merger between two local sides, Poole Rovers and Poole Hornets, who can trace their origins back to 1880, thus the club celebrated their centenary in 1980 with some high profile games against the likes of Manchester Utd, WBA and Manchester City.

The Recent Years:

2000 – 2008: The new millennium saw the club continue to stride forward but further silverware remained just beyond their grasp despite becoming a force in every league they played in. Starting in the Hants Premier division the Dolphins finished runners up in 2000–01, 5th in 2001–02, 4th in 2002–03, and 3rd in 2003–04. Re-alignment of the leagues for the 2004–05 season saw them join the newly formed Wessex Division 2 and gain promotion at seasons end finishing runners-up to Lymington Town FC, the two clubs being 21 points ahead of the rest of the pack. 2006–07 Poole joined the top flight of the Wessex and gained a credible 8th in the much tougher league.

For the 2006–07 the division was renamed Wessex Premier and Poole started promisingly again but their challenge for honours faded with a series of poor results over the Christmas period, however they recovered to finished strongly in 4th. In this period there has been some good cup runs too. Poole reached the Trophyman League Cup quarter-finals in both 2002–03 and 2003–04 and the latter year also saw the Dolphins reach the semifinal of the Dorset Senior Cup losing 1–2 to Gillingham. They repeated the feat again in 2006–07 losing the semi-final to Sherborne by the same margin. 2005–06 saw them get to the Dorset Senior Cup final but the gods contrived to deny them success against Hamworthy on the night.

Their first year in the Wessex in 2004–05 saw them reach the semi-finals of the League cup against all the odds losing to Thatcham Town over two legs, and the following season they reached the semi's again, losing out to Andover that year. The club moved to its current home at Tatnam Farm during this period and continual ground improvements saw the erection of a stand and bar and refreshment facilities and great improvements to the club house and area in general. Poole led the way in the league for much of the 2007–08 season slipping up early

in the new year to eventually finish 4th once more. They also had a good run in the F.A. Vase reaching the 4th round but again suffered disappointment on their other cup competitions.

2008 to date

Sustained Success at last: – That elusive Silverware finally arrived in the 2008–09 season. Poole Town won the Wessex Premier title and were to finish as the second best team of 1,600 Football Association clubs in the whole of England, based on points per match, with the following record: played 42, won 38, drawn 2, lost 2. At the time of securing the title they had been unbeaten in the league and were the top team in the country, but then they inexplicably lost their last two league games! They also won the Dorset Senior Cup (beating Dorchester 2–0 aet), in a thriller at Weymouth's Radipole Lane ground and reached the semi finals of the League Cup. They were, however denied promotion to level 4 due to inadequate ground grading at the Tatnam. They won the Wessex League Title again in 2009–10 by an impressive 18 points and reached the final of the League Cup, but again failed to gain promotion after the plans to build a new ground at Bracksome Rec fell through.

The real coup for the **2009–10** season was more personnel, Top goalscorer, Charlie Austin made the successful leap from Poole to Swindon Town in the Football League Division One. Then moved to Burnley in the Championship.

2010–11 and Poole reached the F.A. Vase semi finals losing out to Whitley Bay. They also won Wessex Premier title for the third successive season once more by a huge 20 point margin and at last gained Promotion back to their spiritual home in the Southern league after a 15 year absence having finally been given permission] to make improvements to the ground to take advantage of the offered Promotion.

The first season back in **2011–12** saw them make a late charge to secure second place behind Champions Bideford. They beat Hungerford convincingly in the play off Semi's and were minutes away from winning the Final against Gosport. But hopes of a second straight promotion were dashed by two late goals from Steve Claridge to send Gosport up to the Southern Premier.

2012-2013 saw the club win the Southern South & West Division by 14 points in addition they won the Dorset Senior Cup, being 4 – 1 winners over Wimborne Town at The County Ground, Hamworthy and finish up with a treble winning the Southern League Championship Trophy match beating Central Division champions Burnham – 1 – 0 on their own ground. Thus for 2013- 14 promotion to the now named Calor League Premier Division was achieved.

2013/14 saw a 7th place finish and also disappointment coming so close to a FA Cup 1st Rd spot losing out to Conference South side Staines Town in a replay at Poole. Off the field by the end of March a new clubhouse, dressing room improvements, new covered standing, new seating installed, new boardroom, new office, new tea bar and new toilets were in place.

2014/15 saw the club in the mix for promotion to Conference South throughout the season unfortunately the final results saw them fall short losing a final day match to Corby Town who won the title. Tuesday 31st March the club won the Red Insure Southern League Cup for the first time drawing 0 – 0 with Corby Town at Tatnam, Poole taking the trophy on the away goals rule after their 1 – 1 at draw at Corby on the 18th March, they were also the winners of the Fair Play award for the Premier Division. The newly formed U21 side also won the Dorset U21 Development League and the U18's reached the 1st Rd Proper of the F.A. Youth Cup finally losing out to Torquay Utd. The players from the previous season stayed together and 2015-16 saw the club go one better and achieve promotion as champions of the Southern Premier Division winning the title by a margin of 9 points from 2nd place Redditch Utd thus yet another new challenge now awaits in the National League South, the club lost out v Whitehawk in the FA Cup 4th Qualifying Rd down in Brighton. Which means over the last 9 seasons the club has won 5 league titles and been runners-up on 2 occasions.

2016-17 saw a 5th place finish in National League South but no play-off place due to ground grading issues despite major ground improvements once again at Tatnam to stave off threats of demotion. Tatnam was also now re-named the Black Gold Stadium. Poole Town U18's also reached the 2nd Rd Proper of the FA Youth Cup losing out to Leyton Orient at Poole in front of a 300+ crowd.

2017-18 saw a final day relegation with the club dropping back into the Southern Premier after two seasons.

2018/19 saw the club reach the Southern League – Premier South play off final after securing 5th spot in the table, after winning the semi final away at Taunton Town which went to a dramatic penalty shootout AET only to lose out at Metropolitan Police by a 1– 0 score line. They did secure the Dorset Senior Cup v Wimborne Town winning 5 – 0 at Dorchester Town in April.

The **2019/20** season saw Poole on course for a Playoff spot, before the league was abandoned, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic. The 2020/21 season Poole were top of the league and looking strong contenders for promotion, before the league was abandoned once again just after Christmas, due to the Covid-19 Pandemic.

In the **2022/23** season saw Poole finish strongly in 4th position in the league with a 17 match unbeaten run towards the end of the season. The semi final play off game was away versus Truro City which ended 1-1, only to lose out on penalties. Truro eventually won promotion after beating Bracknell in the Play off final.

2023/24 season saw several changes in Managers, after long term legend and manager of 20 years, Tom Killick was relieved of his duties early on in the season. Several players also left, following Killick to Dorchester Town. Former AFC Bournemouth player Matt Tubbs took charge of the Dolphins. A change in shape and new players arriving, together with results looking better, things were looking great for Poole until a disastrous run of 7 defeats in a row. This led to another change in manager with Steve Tully replacing Tubbs. Tully steadied the ship and with some good results managed to stay above the relegation places.

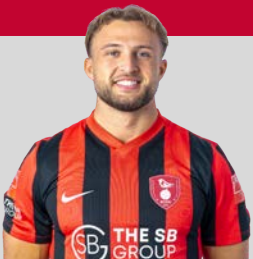

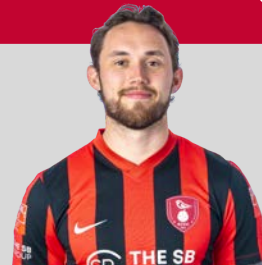

Procedure

Please remember that you are giving encouragement and support to the players to help their development. Enjoy being a spectator, the players appreciate your support.

Obligations towards the game:

1. Show due respect to match officials and others involved in the game.
2. Always have regard to the best interests of the game, including where publicly expressing an opinion on the game and any particular aspect of it, including others involved in the game.
3. Applaud the opposition as well as your own team
4. Do Not use inappropriate language.
5. Do Not enter the field of play at any time.

Respect towards the Match Officials

Supporters should:

1. Respect the decision of the Match Official.
2. Avoid words or actions, which may mislead a Match Official. In the event of an issue during the game parents and spectators must NEVER contact leagues, the opposition, or the officials by telephone, letter or email.

There are official procedures in place for the club to make appeals and protests. Please report any issues to the team manager or the Club Secretary who will take appropriate action and/or refer the matter to the Club.
